Full funding

Stipend, tuition, health insurance, conference travel support.

Mentored apprenticeship

Hands-on research: 20 hrs/week with paired primary and secondary mentors.

Interdisciplinary reach

Subject area and methods training that extends beyond your home discipline.

Career launch

Publications, grant proposal writing experience, and networks that build competitive CVs.

Who is Eligible: Students admitted to one of four PhD programs. Per NRSA rules, T32-funded trainees must be U.S. citizens, non-citizen nationals, or permanent residents. However, students who are not eligible for or who are not otherwise funded through the T32 can apply to be a P3HA Affiliate and participate in P3HA activities.
