The MK-MDT works collaboratively with Faculty Investigators from the Department of Family Medicine and Biobehavioral Health, and academic and community research partners in the US and Canada. Reporting to the Executive Director, this Researcher 5 will be responsible for research activities related to the Indigenous Cultural Understandings of Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementias: Research and Engagement (ICARE) project.

ICARE will address dementia disparities by examining how culture and community-specific context shape Alzheimer's disease and related dementias (ADRD) illness experiences in Indigenous populations. Using ethnographic and community-based approaches the team will integrate the Indigenous lived experience of ADRD in the

creation of culturally appropriate and safe approaches to improve dementia diagnostics, care and outreach.
