About MatCH Program

This one- to two-year interdisciplinary postdoctoral training program provides mentorship and training to enhance the fellow's proficiency in social epidemiology and population sciences, with a Maternal and Child Health (MCH) focus. Selected candidates will use self-directed research to examine a broad range of issues including social and environmental determinants of MCH and health equity. Fellows will engage in an array of program offerings, seminars, and experiential learning opportunities. The MatCH program offers strong mentorship via MCH faculty mentor committee and their partners. It also provides salary, health insurance, and travel funds.

To enhance skills in research, teaching, conceptual knowledge, communication, and leadership



To strengthen the Maternal and Child Health academic pipeline and academic-practice partnerships

- * The personal statement should detail research and practice interests within MCH, prior research and teaching experience, and short and long-term career goals, including goals for the postdoctoral program.

Eligibility

Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Candidates who have completed doctoral training in varied disciplines are eligible and encouraged to apply. Preference will be given to candidates with research-oriented doctorates (e.g., PhD, DrPH, ScD), and whose work focuses on MCH disparities within the U.S. from an equity and social determinants of health lens. Candidates from historically disadvantaged groups by virtue of race, ethnicity, socioeconomic status or other related factors are particularly encouraged to apply. There is specific interest in recruiting individuals from racially/ethnically diverse backgrounds in addition to other underrepresented minoritized backgrounds.
